## PANELISTS AND MODERATOR



**JOSEPH E. STIGLITZ, PH.D.**, is University Professor at Columbia University in New York and Chair of Columbia University's Committee on Global Thought. He is also the co-founder and Executive Director of the Initiative for Policy Dialogue at Columbia. In 2001, he was awarded the Nobel Prize in economics for his analyses of markets with asymmetric information, and he was a lead author of the 1995 Report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, which shared the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize. Professor Stiglitz was a member of the Council of Economic Advisers from 1993-95 and served as CEA chairman from 1995-97. He then became Chief Economist and Senior Vice-President of the World Bank from 1997-2000. In 2008 he was asked by the French President Nicolas Sarkozy to chair the Commission on the Measurement of Economic Performance and Social Progress. In 2009 he was appointed by the President of the United Nations General Assembly as chair of the Commission of Experts on Reform of the International Financial and Monetary System.



**KAREN E. BOROFF, PH.D.**, is the dean of the Stillman School of Business at Seton Hall University, a position that she has held since 2000. Previously, Professor Boroff was the associate dean at the Stillman School. She joined Seton Hall in 1989 as a member of the faculty of the Department of Management, where she taught both undergraduate and graduate courses in management, organizational behavior, negotiations, compensation and industrial relations. Professor Boroff currently serves on several boards, including the Board of Governors of the New York Society of Security Analysts and Beta Gamma Sigma International Business Honor Society. Professor Boroff is the past president of the Middle Atlantic Association of Colleges of Business Administration.



**EUGENE MCCARTHY, PH.D.**, has twenty-seven years of experience with the World Bank, where he successively held managerial responsibilities for oil and gas projects in Middle East, North Africa, and Asia; for energy projects in South Asia, for water supply, sewerage and environmental projects in Caribbean Region and Andean Countries; and disaster management/emergency recovery operations. From 1991 – 1994 Dr. McCarthy was the World Bank's Resident representative in Mexico. After his retirement from the World Bank in 1999, Dr. McCarthy continued to serve as an Independent Consultant to the World Bank. Dr. McCarthy is currently Senior Associate at Washington Associates International and has served as an Economic Advisor to the Holy See Mission since 2004.
